
These digital libraries and e-books would help in delivering resources and possibly online fatwas to those remote users who are not present physically in the same region, thus creating a knowledge pool among the Muslims about Islam. They could be used multipurposely by creating such motion and pictures to attract the viewers. For example, the history of the battles fought in Islam may be studied by showing the maps and pictures of those historical places, elaborating scriptures or hand-written materials' photos to the users in order to better understand the events. A virtual exhibition may also be organized on the web to display Islamic scriptures and manuscripts, thus aiding in education through virtual studies. The Quran itself can be viewed as an e-book on the Internet for the Muslims to read and understand. Recitations and translations are also narrated and recorded with these e-books so that the readers can be familiar with the pronunciation of certain words and avats. The matter that is contained in these digital libraries and e-books cannot be destroyed during disasters as it is not in physical form like other books (the Holy Quran is an exception for which Allah Himself has taken the guarantee to guard it till the Last Day). These digital libraries can therefore be transferred to different locations in digital forms, thereby aiding in the preservation of knowledge.


