The Holy Quran: Text, Translation and Commentary by 'Abdullah Yusuf'Ali (A Critical Review)

Among the English Commentaries of the Holy Qur'ān rendered by the Muslims, *The Holy Qur'ān: Text, Translation and Commentary* by 'Abdullāh Yūsuf Alī, published in 1934 by Sheikh Muhammad Ashraf Publishers, Lahore (United India)(1) is widely known and popular. Its printing was subsidized by Saudi Government and was distributed all over the world free of cost till 2002. With some changes it has now being published by Amana Publications, USA. In the following lines a review of this work is being presented.

About the Author:

'Abdullāh Ibn Khan Bahadur Yūsuf Alī, Hafiz 'Abdullāh Yūsuf Alī (14 April 1872 – 10 December 1953)(2) was a South Asian Islamic scholar who translated the Qur'ān into English. His translation of the Qur'ān ranks alongside the translation of Marmaduke Pickthall as the most widely-known and used in the world.

Birth

He was born in Bombay on 14 April, 1872, in India to a wealthy merchant family.

Family

His father 'Yūsuf Alī Allahbuksh (a Dawoodi Bohra from Saurat in Gujrat) who abandoned the tradional occupation of Family (busines), joined the police force and on retirement was granted the title of Khan Bahadur.

Education

Alī received religious education as a child. He could recite the entire Qur'ān from memory. He studied in Bombay University, St. John's College, Cambridge and Lincoln's Inn. He also studied English literature and studied at several European universities, including the University of Leeds. He spoke both Arabic and English fluently.

Employment

He remained in Indian Civil Service (ICS), Principal of Islamia College Lahore, Member of Punjab University Enquiry Committee, and Chairman of World Congress of Faiths.(3)

B. Abstracts:

Provide on a separate page an abstract of not more than 150 words. This abstract should consist of labeled background, Methods, Results and Conclusion. They should briefly describe, respectively, the problem being addressed in the study, how the study was performed, the salient result and what the authors conclude from the results.

C. Introduction:

State the purpose of the article and summarize the rationale for the study.

D. Key Words:

Include the Key Words relating to the article subject.

E. Results:

Present your results in logical sequence in the text.

F. Discussion:

Emphasize the new and important aspect of the study and conclusions that follow from them.

Link the conclusions with the goals of the study but avoid unqualified statements and conclusions not completely supported by your discussion and references.

G. References:

Text and references must follow the format outlined in *The Chicago Manual of Style* like (al-Ālūsī, Sayyid Muhmud al-Baghdadi. *Rūh al-Ma'ānī*, Cairo: Muniriyah Press, 1353 AH.). All footnotes citing books must contain the complete title, name of the author(s), place of publication, publishing company, and date. All foreign words must be underlined and transliterated. SZIC reserves the right to change the transliteration of all historical names, titles, and non-English terminology to bring conformity with its own style.

Editorial Policy

Format Requirements

A. General Requirements:

Unsolicited Manuscripts must be written in English/Urdu/Arabic. Type the manuscript on white bond paper, 8-1/2×11 inches (21.6×27 cm or A4 size paper) with margins of at least 1.5 inches (4cm). Type on one side of the paper only double spacing every page. Begin each of the following section on separate page and in the following order: Title page, Abstract, Introduction, Results, Discussion, and References. Number pages
