Faith in Predestination and Its Philosophy- An Islamic Perspective

Human being is the best creature on earth. It entails that there should be a best position for human being among all the other creatures of the earth as well as the heavens under the dominion of Allah Almighty (SWT. the God of Muslims), the Omnipotent. It allows the notion that a complete free-will ought to be for all the individuals of the humanity in thoughts and actions to use all the other creatures for its own assistance. The Holy Quran, the basic source of Islamic knowledge, refers to the fact that a man is created free and independent to choose his destiny and live his entire life according to his own will and liberty. Allah (SWT) says in the Holy Quran:

It is further made clear that the faith in predestination does not curb the independence of human efforts towards crafting the ultimate goal, though it Predestination, in Islam, relates to a basic seems doing this apparently. conception treated as fundamental belief of Islam articulated with the terms of 'Al-Qadha', 'Al-qadr' or 'taqdeer'. These Arabic terms are used as alternate for predestination the root meaning of which is decree, judgement, assessment, or ultimate destiny. 'Taqdeer' means to think about how to sort things out. (2) A word 'al-qadha' is also used with al-qadr or as a synonym which means divine will, with the root meaning decision, decree or judgement. 'Qadha' and qadar are two interwoven terms/ matters which cannot be separated from one another, because one is foundation and principle while the other is its structure. It refers to believe in a Divine document written and preserved by Allah Almighty (SWT) before the creation of this universe. All the things to be happened in this universe from its creation to the last day of eternity were already written in that preserved tablet called al-lauh al-mahfooz (the wellguarded tablet). Hence, according to the belief in predestination, all the things are happening in this universe exactly in connection with those predestined

B. Abstracts:

Provide on a separate page an abstract of not more than 150 words. This abstract should consist of labeled background, Methods, Results and Conclusion. They should briefly describe, respectively, the problem being addressed in the study, how the study was performed, the salient result and what the authors conclude from the results.

C. Introduction:

State the purpose of the article and summarize the rationale for the study.

D. Key Words:

Include the Key Words relating to the article subject.

E. Results:

Present your results in logical sequence in the text.

F. Discussion:

Emphasize the new and important aspect of the study and conclusions that follow from them.

Link the conclusions with the goals of the study but avoid unqualified statements and conclusions not completely supported by your discussion and references.

G. References:

Text and references must follow the format outlined in *The Chicago Manual of Style* like (al-Ālūsī, Sayyid Muhmud al-Baghdadi. *Rūh al-Ma'ānī*, Cairo: Muniriyah Press, 1353 AH.). All footnotes citing books must contain the complete title, name of the author(s), place of publication, publishing company, and date. All foreign words must be underlined and transliterated. SZIC reserves the right to change the transliteration of all historical names, titles, and non-English terminology to bring conformity with its own style.

Editorial Policy

SZIC feels honour in providing a podium by publishing original material of interest to the research scholars, *Ulema*, and sociopolitical scientists, in the broad field of Islamic social sciences. *Al-Adwā* is an academic refereed journal published two times a year (Summer and Winter). Manuscript Submission

The Review Procedure

Manuscripts that are submitted to Al- $Adw\bar{a}$ are subject to evaluation by at least two independent referees (including one from technologically advanced countries) who are expert in the applicable field. The decision to accept or reject a manuscript rests solely with Al- $Adw\bar{a}$ ' Editorial Board. This decision is final. The Editorial Board will, however, base its decision primarily upon the recommendations of the referees who have evaluated the paper.

Format Requirements

A. General Requirements:

Unsolicited Manuscripts must be written in English/Urdu/Arabic. Type the manuscript on white bond paper, 8-1/2×11 inches (21.6×27 cm or A4 size paper) with margins of at least 1.5 inches (4cm). Type on one side of the paper only double spacing every page. Begin each of the following section on separate page and in the following order: Title page, Abstract, Introduction, Results, Discussion, and References. Number pages
