Publication Policy of the Journal

Research articles published in this journal are generally of 5,000-7,000 words (including foot-notes) and subject to initial editorial screening, double blind peer review by at least two experts of the field and further editorial review. SUBMISSIONS

All manuscripts, proposals, book reviews and letters to the editor must be submitted via email as attachments in Microsoft Word (or compatible) format with Jameel Noori Nastaleeq font for Urdu and Lotus Linotype for Arabic citations/books to: fikronazar.iri@iiu.edu.pk

Following instructions must be followed while submitting the manuscript:

- 1. The submission must be original and not be contradictory to mainstream Islamic teachings.
- Submissions should not be under consideration elsewhere for publication at the same time, nor should have been published in substantially similar form.
- 3. Submission should include a provisional title both in English and Urdu.
- 4. Each submission must be attached with an English abstract of approximately 200 words along with English translation of the title.

INTRODUCTION TO FIKR-O NAZAR & GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS


